I am sad to report that Debra Abel, AuD has resigned her position on the Board due to her relocation to Arizona. Dr. Abel has served on the Board since 1999 as Audiology Representative, Vice Chair and Chairperson of the Board. She will be missed by her fellow Board Members.

At the January 25 Board meeting I was elected Chairperson and Davida Parsons, M.A.SLP CCC was elected Vice Chair.

The license renewals went quite well this year. The use of the E-License system for on line renewals resulted in quicker turn around for the process and more accurate licensing information for the Board's licensing data base. Over 55% of our licensees took advantage of this option. Our Board was one of the first licensing boards in the state to fully utilize this system and our participation rate of 55% on the first offering was unprecedented.

State Budget Proposal

Governor Taft has recommended consolidation of most of the State Professional Licensing Boards. According to the proposed changes, the Ohio Board of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology would fall under the Ohio Department of Health beginning in July of 2006. The published proposal is provided below:

State of Ohio Professional and Occupational Regulatory Boards

Role and Overview

Ohio has 27 independent professional and occupational licensing boards that set standards for licensure and registration for the members of various professions and occupations and enforce these standards through examination, inspection, investigation, and continuing education. The sizes of these boards range from the State Board of Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics with one full-time employee and an annual budget of approximately \$100,000 to the State Medical Board with 77 full-time employees and an annual budget of \$7.5 million. In fiscal year 2005, the funding for the combined regulatory boards is \$32 million and there are over 336 employees with 200 board members or commissioners.

The Taft Administration proposes to streamline the operations and improve the efficiencies of the regulatory functions by grouping the boards within umbrella agencies: the Departments of Commerce, Health, and Public Safety. The goal of this initiative is to ensure management accountability for all the regulatory boards. This also will enable the boards to better meet their goals to enhance the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the state.

Executive Budget Recommendations

The Executive Budget includes funding for fiscal year 2006 for each of the regulatory boards and commissions; however, no appropriations are included for fiscal year 2007. OBM, working together with each of the three receiving agencies, will develop a budget for fiscal year 2007 based upon projected savings as a result of the consolidation. In addition, the Executive Budget contains temporary law establishing a task force to implement the transfer.

Consolidation Strategy

The consolidation of the regulatory boards and commissions will require the involvement of the Departments of Commerce, Health, Public Safety, Administrative Services, the Office of Budget and Management, and the Governor's Office. Representatives from these agencies will meet during fiscal year 2006 to develop a transition plan to ensure that the consolidation progresses smoothly and that there is no lapse in the activities performed by the boards and commissions. Guiding principles for the transition plan are outlined below.

Actual board and commission members for each regulatory board will be retained and continue to serve in the capacity for which they were appointed.

The Directors of the Departments of Commerce, Health, and Public Safety, or their designees, will be appointed to serve on each of the boards and commissions consolidated within their agencies.

Consolidation and streamlining of administrative activities as well as general activities (such as investigations, license/registration issuance, fee collection, testing, and continuing education monitoring) will be undertaken where reasonable and at the direction of the three receiving agencies.

Current staff will be retained through fiscal year 2006. A hiring freeze will be implemented and an early retirement incentive offered to regulatory board staff. It is expected that these two actions will result in significant staff reductions. Effective July 1, 2006, all remaining regulatory board staff will be transferred to the receiving agencies.

TEXT OF BUDGET BILL

Section 315.03. CONSOLIDATION OF REGULATORY BOARDS

(A) It is the intent of the General Assembly to consolidate the following health-related regulatory boards within the Department of Health not later than July 1, 2006:

- (1) The Chemical Dependency Professionals Board;**
- (2) The Board of Chiropractic Examiners;**
- (3) The Counselor, Social Worker, and Marriage and Family Therapist Board;**
- (4) The State Dental Board;**
- (5) The Ohio Board of Dietetics;**
- (6) The State Medical Board;**
- (7) The Board of Nursing;**
- (8) The Ohio Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, and Athletic Trainers Board;**
- (9) The Ohio Optical Dispensers Board;**
- (10) The State Board of Optometry;**
- (11) The State Board of Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics;**
- (12) The State Board of Pharmacy;**
- (13) The State Board of Psychology;**
- (14) The Ohio Respiratory Care Board;**
- (15) The Board of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology;**
- (16) The State Veterinary Medical Licensing Board.**

(B) It is the intent of the General Assembly to consolidate the following regulatory boards and commissions within the Department of Commerce not later than July 1, 2006:

- (1) The Accountancy Board;**
- (2) The State Board of Examiners of Architects;**
- (3) The Ohio Athletic Commission;**
- (4) The Barber Board;**
- (5) The State Board of Cosmetology;**
- (6) The Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors;**
- (7) The State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors;**
- (8) The Manufactured Homes Commission;**
- (9) The Board of Motor Vehicle Collision Repair Registration;**
- (10) The State Board of Sanitarian Registration.**

(C) It is the intent of the General Assembly to consolidate the Ohio Medical Transportation Board within the Department of Public Safety not later than July 1, 2006.

(D) The Director of Budget and Management and the Directors of Administrative Services, Commerce, Health, and Public Safety shall appoint representatives to a transition team.

The transition team shall develop a plan to ensure the smooth and timely consolidation of the boards into the respective departments. The transition team shall address the details of the consolidations, identifying necessary statutory changes and working with the Office of Budget and Management to develop budgets for the respective departments and the consolidated boards and commissions. The transition team may recommend additional regulatory boards or commissions to be consolidated and may recommend modifications to the planned consolidations.

The transition team shall submit a report containing recommendations and the details for the consolidations not later than December 31, 2005, to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate. The report and recommendations shall address the following issues, and may address additional issues:

- (1) The necessary levels of funding;**
- (2) The savings projected as a result of the consolidations;**
- (3) The consolidation of activities between each board or commission and the department providing centralized services, including the role of the members of the board or commission and the role of the department;**
- (4) The staffing levels needed, whether employees must be retained, and whether any employees retained have civil service status;**
- (5) The continuation of the standards and procedures of the board or commission;**
- (6) The continuation of rules and whether any rules need to be amended as a result of the consolidations;**
- (7) The transfer of assets, liabilities, and contractual obligations;**
- (8) The transfer of records and other materials pertaining to the board or commission.**

(E) It is the intent of the General Assembly to introduce a bill in fiscal year 2006 that will include the necessary statutory changes to effect the consolidations and that will include revised appropriations for the departments and the consolidated boards and commissions for fiscal year 2007.

Some of the topics for CEUs are performance based assessment, curricular issues (literacy), and relevant IEPs. NCSLPS CEU prices are a significant value.
