INTRODUCTION TO THE P.L.A.Y. PROJECT

This intensive workshop gives participants an overview of the methods and techniques of the PLAY Project, an evidence-based early intervention program for children with autism spectrum disorder. Participants engage in hands-on activities, including video case studies, so they can immediately incorporate PLAY Project techniques into their experiences with young children. A summary of the latest autism research including prevalence, treatment options, and the new DSM V diagnostic criteria will be presented. No prior knowledge is needed to attend.

After attending the workshop, participants will be able to:

- Describe some developmental interventions for an autistic child
- Gain a basic understanding of Greenspan's 6 Functional Developmental Levels
- Generate a basic child profile
- Understand the importance of a child's affect/feeling life
- Explain how The PLAY Project provides family members with support and resources to enhance their child's learning and development
- Integrate basic PLAY Project techniques into every day experiences and interactions with infants and toddlers
